### **Workshop in Sign Language**



#### **Halloween Workshop**

On October 25, City Representative Ines Hasanagic, '23, organized a Halloween workshop with "Radosti Druzenja" - an association for socializing individuals with mental disabilities in Bihac.

Ines' project included a group of 14 members, ages 17 to 60, with the help of three staff members and one face painter. The activities included the "Monster Mash" song and mash dance, pumpkin carving and painting, making candle holders from jars, making Halloween decorations, spiders made out of pipe cleaners and googly eyes, and face painting.

During the event, they listened to American Halloween songs for children. They celebrated by enjoying snacks and refreshments at the end while talking about their likes, dislikes, lives, daily struggles, and Ines' exchange experience.

Ines came up with the idea for the project after she came across the association's Facebook page and saw a lack of activities with adult members who are rarely talked about and often left out of society and other groups, even their own family, as she later heard from the center's staff members.

## YES PY 24-25 Promotion



On October 28, our YES Abroad cohort visited the town of Travnik as part of their cultural enrichment activities!


